FORMING GOOD STEWARDS

The 2008 Summer Olympic Games in Beijing were wonderful. Thousands of athletes who devoted their lives to developing their physical abilities and mastering skills for the chance to be awarded a gold medal; hundred of thousands of coaches and spectators; hundreds of millions of T.V. viewers—all gathered in the name of sports. In a country where two or three gathered in the name of Jesus may be watched by two or more government spies, some competitors made the sign of the cross; some pointed up to the sky; others knelt down with hands folded and head bowed. They were boldly acknowledging God as the source of their abilities and the opportunity to use their skills. We are blessed to live in a country where it is still possible to gather in large numbers to acknowledge God as the source of all that we have, all that we are and all that we ever will be. Do we acknowledge God as that source: Why do we gather in relatively small numbers (30% of "Catholics" in church on Sundays)? Do we truly gather in the name of Jesus?
