MISSIONARIES OF JESUS

Next weekend we will have with us Rev.Rey Tejico, representing the Missionaries of Jesus in a mission appeal.

Rev. Rey Tejico was born in Iloilo, Philippines and was ordained in Guatemala, Central America on 23 September 1994. He worked with the displaced communities in the marginalized area of Guatemala City from 1991-2002. He then rendered services in the Philippines among the Aetas native communities in Rizal from 2002-2006.

From June 2007 up to the present, he works with two members of the Missionaries of Jesus in the Apostolic Vicariate of Paten, Guatemala. The primary evangelization task is to bring personally the presence of Jesus in the 45 villages within our pastoral care, to announce the message of hope and to celebrate Life with the people as a Church and through the sacraments.

MISSIONARY WORK WHICH WILL BE SUPPORTED BY THIS APPEAL

A) Who and where we are:

The Missionaries of Jesus (MJ) is an international and multicultural religious missionary community. It was founded in the Philippines on 12 June 2002 by a group of forty-one men called and inspired by the mission and humanity of Jesus, who calls us to “make disciples of all nations” (Mt. 28:19). Our missionaries are in the Diocese of Lae in Papua New Guinea, in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, in various dioceses of the Philippines and in the Apostolic Vicariate of Peten, Guatemala.

B) Present activities and Projects

The new parish is composed of three sectors (zones): 1) Tierra Blanca, having 10 communities; 2) Del Rosal, 9 communities; and 3) Mirrador, 22 communities. It consists of about 1800 sq. kms. The communities (villages) are generally found along the roadside and can be reached by vehicles. Others may be reached by hiking five to twenty kilometers from roads. The new parish is starting from scratch in terms of finances and formation of lay leaders.

1) Catechetical training of the faithful is realized by trained catechists. Lay ministers assist the need of the faithful in terms of liturgical celebration, evangelization and social assistance. The missionaries are responsible for the training of the catechists and ministers through regular seminars and workshops held in the three sectors of the mission (Tierra Blanca, El Mirador and El Rosal).

2) The Missionaries of Jesus visit and animate the different communities of the mentioned sectors at least three to five times a year.

3) Upon the identification of concrete needs of the people, the Missionaries of Jesus assist the people in establishing social and human development projects to alleviate poverty, enhance health conditions of the people, defend people from situations of injustice and promote indigenous identity.
