- Reading I Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24
By the envy of the devil, death entered the world
Psalm 30 "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me."
Reading II 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15
Your abundance should supply the needs of the poor.
Gospel: Mark 5:21-43
Little girl, I say to you, arise.

Throughout the Sundays of Ordinary Time, the first reading from the Old Testament prepares us to hear the Gospel. Today the book of Wisdom proclaims God's concern for our health and well-being. In the Gospel, Jesus heals and raises to life. In both instances, those who seek Jesus' help already believe, for in Mark's Gospel, Jesus always heals in response to faith and never to manufacture faith. In the second reading, Paul encourages the Corinthians to give generously to needy Christians beyond their community and thus imitate Christ who, though rich, made himself poor for our sake.
