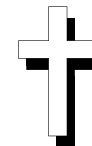

- Reading I Isaiah 53:10-11
Psalm 33
Reading II Hebrews 4:14-16
Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

Throughout Ordinary Time, the Old Testament reading orients us to the Gospel's principal point. Today, Isaiah describes God's servant as having "borne our infirmities and carried our sufferings." For Christians, this servant is Jesus, bearer of our sins. But the disciples fail to understand that true greatness consists in imitating Jesus' humble service of others.

This weekend we welcome Bishop Jarrell to our parish. He is here to celebrate with us the 10th anniversary of the St. Landry Cemetery Tours. Bishop Jarrell will celebrate the 4pm Mass Saturday evening and then after a brief dinner will enjoy the cemetery tour. We are grateful to Bishop Jarrell for being with us this weekend both for worship at Mass and for the cemetery tours. As the cemetery tours continue today and tomorrow, we remember the purpose of the tours and our devotion to those who have gone before us. The promise of Christ is eternal life, and His Resurrection (and thus our resurrection) on the Last Day is both in body and spirit. We treat the body of those who have passed from this life to the next with reverence because it is a Temple of the Holy Spirit while we live on earth, and will be raised up on the Last Day in Glory.
