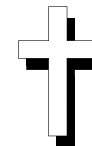


MASS INTENTIONS

Mass Page 271 in Missalette

Reading I Deuteronomy 6:2-6 Hear, O Israel! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.

Psalms 18 "I love you, Lord, my strength."

Reading II Hebrews 7:23-28 Because he remains forever, he has a priesthood that does not pass away.

Gospel: Mark 12:28b-34 Love the Lord your God. Love your neighbor.

The words of today's first reading from Deuteronomy form the prayer recited several times daily by devout Jewish believers. Therefore, Jesus himself knew these words well and recited them often. In the Gospel, Jesus declares them to be the first commandment. But then Jesus adds another command from Leviticus, so that love of God and love of neighbor become the rule of life for his disciples in every generation. In this month of All Saints and All Souls, the second reading from Hebrews pictures Jesus as our high priest forever interceding for us in the kingdom of heaven.
